To perform the Corporal Work of Mercy of burying the dead and to care for their resting places; to preserve, promote and protect the Church's teachings on death and resurrection; and to console the bereaved.


A popular reading at funeral liturgies is from the Old Testament Book of

CREMATION AND THE CATHOLIC CHURCH Guidelines to be followed

The Catholic Church has officially allowed cremation since 1963 with the expectation that the body would be brought to the Church for the funeral liturgy followed by cremation. More recently, the Holy See has authorized the celebration of funeral liturgies in the United States with cremated remains present. According to the Order of Christian Funerals, "The cremated remains of a body should be treated with the same respect given to the human body from which they come. This includes the use of a worthy vessel to contain the ashes, the manner in which they are carried, the care and attention to appropriate placement and transport and the final disposition. The cremated remains should be buried in a grave or entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium. The practice of scatter-

ing cremated remains on the sea, from the air, on the ground, or keeping cremated remains in the home of a relative or friend of the deceased are not the reverent disposition that the Church requires." (Order # 417) This is why the burial of ashes in the earth or placement in a tomb or columbarium is called for. The Catholic Church desires to keep holy the burial places of the dead - and to make them places of prayer. This is why it is always desirable to commit the remains of our loved ones in a blessed cemetery with appropriate marks of remembrance. CEMETERY RULES AND REGULATIONS Please Be Reminded

In the spirit of maintaining the sacred nature and dignity of the Catholic cemetery, the following will be enforced. We ask for your understanding and your cooperation.

Permitted:

- Planting in approved planting bed up to one foot in front of memorial. Area is to be maintained free of weeds and grass.
- •Artificial flowers:
 - -in approved permanent vases -in approved planting beds -on an upright memorial
- Faded, rotten or worn flowers will be removed.
- Christmas decorations from the first Sunday in Advent to February 28.
- Easter decorations from the first Sunday in Lent through Ascension Thursday.
- •Other holiday decorations such as Mother's Day, Memorial Day, Father's Day and All Souls Day.
- Approved solar vigil lights.

Not Permitted:

- Planting or decorating during the general cemetery cleanup occurring in the month of March.
- Any shrubs, trees or bushes.
- Anything that represents a safety hazard such as: statues, borders, marble chips, fencing, wire, toys, glass, rocks, bottles, cans, stones or gravel.
- Flowers or objects that are unsightly or detract from the spiritual setting of a Catholic cemetery.
- Pets, trail vehicles, littering and loitering.
- Hanging items on tree branches.
- Regrettably, we cannot be responsible for anything placed at the grave or crypt site.
