Final Resting Places for Veterans

In recognition of the sacrifices made for us by our veterans, The Catholic Cemeteries Association provides resting places in each of the diocesan cemeteries honoring those who have faithfully served our country. The Association has established two sections to honor our veterans in Queen of Heaven Cemetery and in Good Shepherd Cemetery. These sections are unique in that they not only provide space for the veteran and spouse but for other family members as well.

A beautiful granite memorial located in each section recognizes the contributions these veterans have made to their country. Features of the memorial include insignias of the six branches of the Armed Services, etchings of scenes from some of the major conflicts in which the United States has been involved and a Roll of Honor, in which the names of veterans can be inscribed.

Veterans who are honorably discharged are entitled to a free burial space in these sections.

- Government headstone, marker or medallion
- Burial flag
- Presidential Memorial Certificate
- Military funeral honors
